APPENDIX 1:

Child Protection Policy of Cong N.S.

The Board of Management recognises that child protection and welfare considerations permeate all aspects of school life and must be reflected in all of the school's policies, practices and activities. Accordingly, in accordance with the requirements of the Department of Education and Skills' Child Protection Procedures for Primary and Post Primary Schools', the Board of Management of Cong N.S. has agreed the following child protection policy;

- 1. The Board of Management has adopted and will implement fully and without modification the Department's Child Protection Procedures for Primary and Post Primary Schools' as part of this overall child protection policy.
- The Designated Liaison Person (DLP) is Pauline Waldron.
- 3. The Deputy Designated Liaison Person (Deputy DLP) is Mary Fitzgerald.
- 4. In its policies, practices and activities, Cong N.S. will adhere to the following principles of best practice in child protection and welfare;

The school will

- *recognise that the protection and welfare of children is of paramount importance, regardless of all other considerations.
- *fully co-operate with the relevant authorities in relation to child protection and welfare matters.
- *adopt safe practices to minimise the possibility of harm or accidents happening to children and protect workers from the necessity to take unnecessary risks that may leave themselves open to accusation of abuse or neglect.
- *develop a practice of openness with parents that involves consulting them about issues that concern their children, and encouraging to get involved with the school wherever possible.
- *fully respect confidentiality requirements in dealing with child protection matters.

 The school will also adhere to the above principles in relation to any adult pupil with a special vulnerability.
